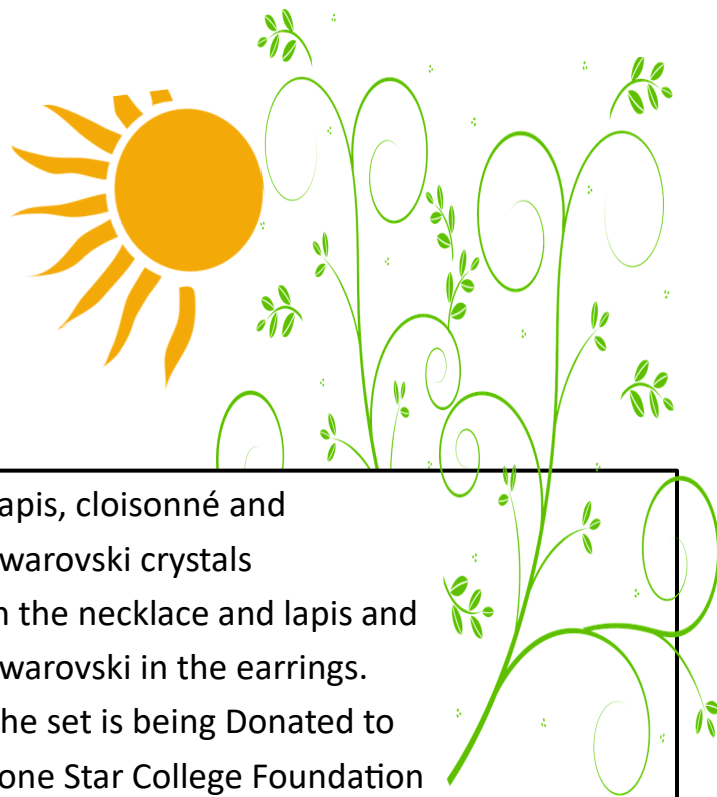

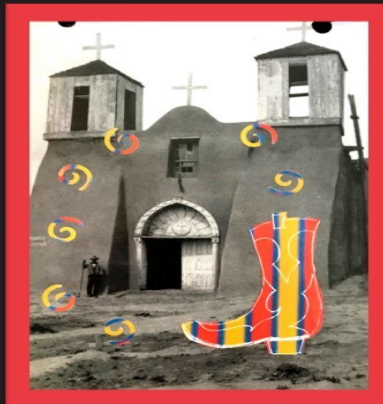

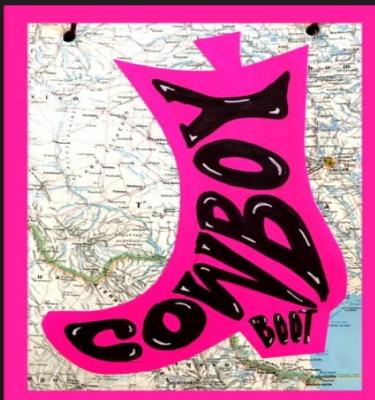

Italian Meatloaf

- 1/4 cup + 2 T EVOO
- 6 Large Cloves Garlic, chopped fine
- 2 Medium Yellow Onions, diced fine
- 2 Red Bell Peppers, diced fine
- 1/2 cup Fresh Basil Leaves, chopped
- 2 T Fresh Parsley, Leaves only, chopped
- 4 X-Large Eggs, lightly beaten
- 2 t Kosher Salt (If using table salt use 1t)
- 1 t Freshly Ground Pepper
- 2 cups Freshly Grated Parmesan Cheese
- 1/4 cup Panko Breadcrumbs
- 6 Slices of White Bread, crust removed, torn into small pieces
- 1 cup Whole Milk
- 2 Large Carrots, peeled and shredded
- 3 - 4# Ground Sirloin
- 1# Ground Pork
- 1# Ground Veal
- 2-1/2 T Worcestershire Sauce
- 2 T Balsamic Vinegar
- 1 Jar Marinara Sauce
- 6 T Brown Sugar
- 1 t Dry Mustard Powder



Preheat Oven to 350

Place the torn bread pieces and the 1 cup of milk into a small bowl and let soak until needed to mix into the meat mixture.

Heat the 1/4 c of EVOO in a saute pan over medium heat and add the onions with a pinch of salt and saute until the onions become translucent. Add the chopped peppers and saute until soft, add the garlic and saute for about 30 seconds. Remove to a plate and let cool completely.

Mix together the parsley, basil, eggs, salt, pepper, 2-1/2 T Worcestershire Sauce and Balsamic Vinegar and set aside until needed for the meat mixture.

Combine the Parmesan and Panko breadcrumbs in small bowl.

Mix together the 3 meats gently, being careful to not overmix. Use your fingers like claws when mixing. Add the soaked bread mixture, Parmesan cheese and Panko breadcrumbs and mix gently into the meat. Add the onion mixture, herb mixture and the 2 T EVOO and mix , being careful to not overmix.

Gently pat the mixture into 3 oiled loaf pans.

Mix together the Marinara sauce with the brown sugar and mustard powder.

Spread the Marinara sauce evenly over the 3 meatloaves in the loaf pans.

Bake on a cookie sheet on the center rack in the oven for 50 to 60 minutes. If you are planning on freezing any of the meatloaves, bake for 40 minutes, let cook completely and wrap in two layers of plastic wrap and place in freezer bag and freeze for up to 3 months. When ready to finish baking, remove from plastic wrap and allow to thaw completely in the loaf pan that you will be baking in. Set your oven to 375 and bake for 35 to 40 minutes until heated thru and an instant read thermometer reads a 160.
